Timeline for year 1 of the SDGs working group

- Signed up to the SDG Publishers Compact (Dec 2020)
- Established the IOS Press SDG working group (Q1 2021)
- Initial priority goals:
 - SDG 5 (gender equality)
 - SDG 10 (reduced inequalities)
 - SDG 12 (responsible consumption and production)
 - SDG 17 (partnerships for the goals)
 - SDG 13 (climate action)
- Published the IOS Press' <u>Diversity and Inclusion Statement</u> (DIS) (Q3 2021)
- Represented on ALPSP's working group on diversity and inclusion (Sep 2021)
- Signed a <u>Joint commitment for diversity and inclusion in publishing</u> (Oct 2021)




Gender equality & reduced inequalities

- Initial assessment of the geographical diversity of IOS Press' authors
- Editors-in-Chief are being invited to support the IOS Press' DIS and to have their editorial boards analyzed in relation to gender diversity

Call to action

About 35 journals published by IOS Press already support the DIS and have diversity and inclusion actions in place. Such actions include, but are not limited to:

- Support access for authors, readers, and institutions from low-income countries via Research4Life
- Promote professional growth within the journal
- Promote geographical diversity among authors with punctual actions, including the promotion of publisher's actions for more equality
- Where possible, aim for a geographically and gender balanced panel of reviewers
- Consider gender-focused special issues (guest editors and commissioned authors)
- Take gender into account when identifying guest editors and authors to create a platform for more balanced and diverse voices
- Promote journal/book content relating to SDG 5 and SDG 10 on IOS Press webpages
- Engage in a regular review and make this an ongoing conversation

Initial feedback

Responsible consumption and production

- Reduce amount of print copies to improve environmental footprint
- Consider prioritizing electronic services, company wide
- Aim to choose ecologically sound paper and materials for printing
- Opt for sustainable marketing:
 - "Green"/eco approach for conference materials
 - Less paper & fewer journal copies on display, i.e. direct audience to online content
 - Travel to conferences to be taken into consideration.

Partnerships for the goals

- Prioritize partners/suppliers who have sustainability on their agenda
- Encourage partners/suppliers who do not have an environmental statement to implement one

Looking ahead, we will start using a structured approach for our organizational focus on sustainability relating to **SDG 13 Climate Action** and we suggest:

- Use the globally recognized reporting tool **GRI Standards** for selecting, addressing, and reporting on our sustainability goals
- Implement the UN Global Compact Communication Progress Standards to inform on our progress in reaching our goals
- Work towards joining The Climate Pledge (<u>theclimatepledge.com</u>); this can only happen if/when we qualify for the acceptance criteria
- Strive to make our publishing company Net Zero by 2040

Ongoing plans & outlook

Annually, the IOS Press sustainability governance structure can be considered by:

- Identifying areas where our impact can be improved
- Assessing how important these impacts will be and prioritize them
- Determining how we will report on progress
- Describing how we will manage actions to create impact

In doing this, we will be using the UN Global Compact Communication Progress Standards to inform on our progress in reaching our goals.
