Definitions:

- Article = the published article in an edited volume or a conference proceedings, peer reviewed and typeset in the Publisher's format, a.k.a. the Version of Record

1. Grant of Rights

By accepting this License to Publish, you hereby grant the Publisher the exclusive right, unlimited in time and territory, to publish, republish, transmit, sell, distribute, store, and/or otherwise use the Article in whole or in part, including abstracts thereof, in all languages and in all media of expression now known or later developed, and to license or permit others (including but not limited to Reproduction Rights Organisations such as the Copyright Clearance Centre) to do so. Furthermore, you grant the Publisher the right to use the Article in whole or in part, in the edited volume or conference proceedings, as stand-alone and/or with other related material in databases, data networks and for multimedia purposes including the right to alter the Article if necessary for these purposes.
